In an extraordinary act of generosity Sale philanthropist, **John Leslie**, has donated \$50,000 to go toward the construction of a 200 seat grandstand adjacent to Court 10. As courts 9 and 10 are already in the process of being upgraded to international standard a new grandstand will compliment perfectly these new feature courts.

John recently had an inspection of the area where the grandstand will be erected and was impressed with the progress that we have made on our renovation program over the last few years. A very keen tennis player in his younger days John is still a member at Kooyong and attends the Australian Open every year. John was a keen spectator at our ATCG International but was struck by the obvious need to better accommodate the large numbers of spectators that attended throughout the eight days of the tournament. It was apparent to him that a grandstand would not only be an advantage during the Pro Circuit tournament but would be a tremendous boost to our day to day pennant competitions and our local tournaments. We wish to thank John for his generosity in supporting our Club and look forward to welcoming him to our grand opening some time before our Pro Circuit event in October.

With the assistance of Macalister Prestige Homes plans have been drawn for an arched roof structure that will extend and cover the existing stepped area. The stepped area will be expanded toward the end of the court in both directions so that we have the majority of the seating in shade but some of the seats at each end will still enjoy our beautiful Gippsland sun.

Sale Turf Club has generously donated the fixed seating from their Members Stand that is currently scheduled for an extensive upgrade. These seats are in great condition and will allow us to substantially complete our project within budget. We wish to thank Wayne Pollock from the Sale Turf Club for this wonderful initiative and are delighted to see local sporting clubs working together to get positive outcomes for the community.

Longford Tennis Club to Benefit from Sale Upgrades

While on the subject of co-operation between clubs, with the removal of the old lights from courts 9 and 10 we have been able to donate these poles and lights to the Longford Tennis Club. Sale Players Dominate SHTA Championships

Sale Tennis Club provided all of the four finalists in the Open Singles events in the SHTA Championships played in March. In the Women's Open **Krystal Rawnsen** defeated **Jess Luke** 6 – 2, 6 – 3 in the final to claim her third SHTA title. Krystal backed up with her fourth Girls 18 & Under title as well. Our Club Champion has had a wonderful season, winning almost everything that she entered and her best is yet to come. A special acknowledgment also goes to Jess Luke who made her first SHTA final. Jess has had a great SHTA season with Sale and continues to improve. The Open Singles title is well within her reach at some time in the future.

In the Open Men's Singles Final **Abe Schuback** defeated 2007 winner, **Mark Elliman**, 6 – 4, 6 – 0. Like Krystal, Abe has had a stellar season. In a great performance **Bree Kaandorp** and **Jess Lauria** fell just short in the A Grade Women's Doubles going down 5-8 to a more experienced pair. Look out for them next year as they were so, so close this year.

Sharon Lauria teamed with **Debbie Cooper** in the Women's D Grade Doubles to take out the title 8-6. Well done Sharon and Debbie. In the Under 14 Girls **Emma Waite** defeated **Elise Clottin** 8-5.

In the Under 19 Boys Singles **Tom Young** was successful in the final, taking it out 8-2. In a timely lesson to all players, Tom was ultimately awarded the title when his opponent threw his racquet into the grandstand, narrowly missing his opponent and the gathered spectators and was immediately defaulted by the match referee. The final highlight of the tournament was a Sale player being awarded the Good Sportsmanship award for the tournament. For the first year an individual was awarded a sportsmanship award based on the way they conducted themselves throughout the tournament. Grant Success to Fund Ongoing Upgrades

Sale Tennis Club has been successful with two more grant applications over the past few months.

Lighting Upgrade to Courts 6 – 8

Minister for Sport, Recreation and Youth Affairs, James Merlino, announced on a recent visit to Sale that we have been successful in receiving \$34,000 for the upgrade to modern side lighting of courts 6, 7 and 8. This would give us all 14 lit courts under the modern side lighting and end the ability to blame the lights for those bad shots that so consistently sneak into all of our games. We hope to have these upgrades ready for the new night season in 2009. Our grant application included an application for funds to build a shade structure over the area adjacent to Court 6 but this was unsuccessful this time around. This project is still on our agenda at some time in the future when funds allow.

Refurbishment of Courts 15 - 18

Tennis Australia has advised that we have been successful in applying for funds under the National Court Rebate Scheme. Tennis Australia will contribute \$66,000 toward the refurbishment of courts 15, 16, 17 and 18. We will fully reinstate these courts to their previous best. This upgrade is well overdue with the courts now at least 10 years beyond their intended playing life. The balance of the funds will assist us to complete the fantastic upgrade of courts 9 and 10 which will become the best feature courts in Gippsland when finished. These upgrades are well under way and excitement is beginning to build around their completion. It will be great to get on to these courts and give them a full workout.

This injection of \$100,000 into our upgrade program is in addition to the \$60,000 announced last year and a further \$5,500 from the State Government which will go a long way toward fully modernising our playing facilities.

Night Pennant Player Lists

Our night pennants are now entering finals and we will have a full report on the winners, grinders and near misses next newsletter.

However now is the time to get your name on the sheet for next season's pennant which will start in mid July. The sheets are up on the Clubhouse notice board and we would love to see them full of enthusiastic players' names. COACH'S CORNER

Tip for Winter.

- Warm up correctly before playing competition tennis (stretching, light movements)
- You should be lightly sweating before the match starts.
- Cover all shots in your hit up.

Forehands

The biggest mistake players make when trying to execute a forehand (either open or closed stance), is they don't rotate their shoulders enough. Try pointing your left shoulder (right handed player) at the oncoming ball. This will mean that your trunk is fully rotated before contacting the ball and therefore will ensure that you have to expend less energy in the actual contact of the ball.
